	will be charged \$25. per hour for a vehicle returned late and 1-1/2 the daily rental rate for each day the vehicle is late. REMEMBER –Other people may be waiting for the vehicle. Please contact our office if you are going to be delayed. No vehicle may be picked up or returned on Saturday or Sunday.
2.	RESERVATION DEPOSIT: Required on all rentals: Weekend; 1-2 weeks; 3 or more weeks - 1 week rental fee. THE RESERVATION DEPOSIT IS NOT REFUNDABLE.
3.	<b>SECURITY DEPOSIT:</b> required at time of departure.Refundable within 5 business days of return providing the vehicle is clean (inside and outside), holding tanks are empty, gas and propane are full and the vehicle is not damaged or abused.
4.	<b>CLEANING DEPOSIT:</b> deposit required on all rentals. Refundable within 5 business days of return providing the vehicle is as clean inside and outside as when it was received.
5.	Gasoline and propane tanks are released full and must be returned full. If not, the renter will be charged a service charge to fill the gasoline tank plus the cost of gas at per gallon. A service charge will also be levied to full the propane plus the cost of propane at per gallon.
6.	A dumping fee of will be charged if the holding tanks are not empty upon return.
7.	A sanitation fee will be charged for pets.
8.	WINTERIZING FEE: Required on all winter rentals. This fee is not refundable.



### **RENTAL CHECK LIST**

We've tried to think of everything in assembling information which you might find of value in renting a recreational vehicle and planning your trip. In case we've missed something, don't hesitate to ask. It is important to remember that the owner thinks very highly of his RV and wants it returned in the same condition that you received it. In effect, you are renting a home on wheels so treat it with respect.

### MECHANICAL OPERATION OF THE MOTORHOME

**ENGINE COMPARTMENT:** Basically, this is the same as your car. If in doubt about any portion of the front compartment, let your service station attendant do the servicing. **IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT** that you keep a sharp eye on the engine temperature and pressure gauges. If there is anything abnormal, shut the engine down. Better safe than sorry.

**WATER AND OIL:** It is necessary to check water and oil each time in refueling. If traveling in excessive hot weather and engine is overheating, **STOP!** 

**FAN BELTS:** If a fan belt breaks, do not keep traveling because the engine will overheat if the fan is not operating. Replace the fan belt.

**TIRES - CHECK TIRES EACH TIME YOU STOP** - Especially the rear duals, as you could have a flat and not know it thereby putting yourself in danger of fine and ruining the tire, and or the wheel.

**STOW OUTSIDE STEP BEFORE MOVING MOTORHOME:** The reason being, the step makes the motorhome wider than eight feet wide which is the legal limit, and you could receive a ticket. Also in the down position the step can be damaged and that is the lessee's responsibility.

**FUEL TANKS:** They are 40 to 70 gallons, depending on the size of the motorhome you have. Your mileage will depend on your driving habits. If you keep your speed down to 45 or 50 mph, you may get 6 to 8 mpg on your fuel. Anything over 50 mph and you can figure on lowering your mileage to 5 to 7 mpg. All propane must be shut off when fueling the motorhome.

**GENERATOR:** (Power plant) located in the rear of the motorhome. Generator can be running while your motorhome is traveling. To have 110 volt power for lights and air conditioner on the roof, generator must be running. Generator switch to start and stop is usually located on the dash of the motorhome or can be near the monitor panel. All lights are 12 volt. The 12 volt runs off the battery and should not be left on or the battery will run down. If the battery should run down, start the generator and it will charge the battery. If you have any problems starting the generator, attempt to start it in the rear compartment by choking it with the throttle linkage. If you still have problems, call for further assistance.

**PROPANE:** The tanks will be completely full upon your departure and you must refill them before you return. Should you run out of propane (which is unlikely as there is enough in the tanks for 4 to 6 weeks) check the yellow pages in your immediate area under motorhome services. Make sure that you are out of propane and that the pilot light has not gone out. If it is propane, your oven, stove and refrigerator will not light. Do not attempt to fill the tanks yourself, go to a professional.

**TOILET, SEWER SYSTEM, HOLDING TANK:** To empty holding tank... On driver's side underneath the motorhome is where the drain for holding tank is located. At the rear of the motorhome either in the bumper or right beneath the bumper, the sewer drain hose is located. Take the sewer hose and attach to holding tank drain. Attach the other end to a dumping facility. Open valve to drain holding tank. Same operation applies when hooking to sewer facilities in a park and leave valve open at all times. When holding tank is empty, replace sewer drain hose and replace sewer tank cap. You can visually see when holding tank is reaching full by flushing toilet and looking down the drain. While draining holding tank, run water through toilet bowl and into tank to flush out residue in tank. **WHEN YOU RETURN THE MOTORHOME, BE SURE HOLDING TANKS ARE EMPTY.** 

**REFRIGERATOR: MOTORHOME MUST BE LEVEL FOR REFRIGERATION TO OPERATE.** Refrigeration pilot can go out. It must be relit to operate. The outside temperature must be taken into consideration regarding full efficiency of the refrigerator. Continually opening and closing refrigerator door will lessen the efficiency and raise the temperature inside the refrigerator. It is suggested that you place the refrigerator on the electric mode when hooked up to outside electricity.

**RECHARGE TOILET:** When holding tank has been drained, take package of chemicals and put down toilet drain while flushing the toilet. In most cases, shower and sink water does not go into sewer holding tank. Most motorhomes have 2 separate holding tanks.

### RENTAL CHECK LIST

**POWER FAILURE:** If you have an electrical power failure be sure to check breaker switches and or fuses that may apply, located inside or outside of motorhome. Breaker switch shuts off automatically if becoming overloaded with air conditioners and appliances. If you have difficulty locating breakers, the owners manuals will help you locate them.

**LOADING UP:** When loading, don't create road-handling problems by concentrating heavy items on one side, or at the real or overhead. Items stored in overhead cabinets, especially heavy objects, can fly out in a panic stop or collision. It is a good idea to place in a plastic bin any bottles that may break and spill liquids.

#### THE FOLLOWING TIPS CAN PREVENT DAMAGE AND SAVE YOU MONEY

WHEN BACKING UP: ALWAYS HAVE SOMEONE AT THE REAR OF THE MOTORHOME TO CHECK FOR CLEARANCE. There can always be an object such as a short post that would be impossible to see from the side mirrors and much damage results when the bumper is caught on such items. When you take your RV into boondock areas for hunting or fishing, always point the vehicle headed out toward the road. Then, should an emergency require quick departure, you lose no time maneuvering to turn the vehicle around, or risk getting bogged down or backing off the road into a ditch in the darkness.

**EMERGENCY ROOF EXITS:** Are to be opened only in the event of an emergency. They are easily cracked if not opened properly and closed in the same manner.

ALL OUTSIDE ACCESS DOORS TO OUTSIDE COMPARTMENTS ARE TO BE LOCKED, LATCHED OR SECURED - TO PREVENT ANY LOST ITEMS STORED INSIDE THEM.

**LOCK ENTRY DOOR FROM INSIDE BEFORE TRAVELING:** The door can come open while moving and do damage to the door as well as the motorhome.

**SECURE REFRIGERATOR DOOR:** If food or bottles are not stored properly in the refrigerator, upon opening after traveling they will fall out and possibly stain the carpeting.

#### WHAT TO DO IF...

**WATER BACKS UP INTO THE SHOWER:** The holding tank for waste-water from shower and sinks is probably full. If you are not near a dumping station, you can run excess water into a large pail placed beneath the waste-water (not the sewage) outlet while at a campground. But before you leave the campground, carry the pail to an emptying facility. Because some campers have spoiled campsites by pouring waste-water on them, some states outlaw use of the open pail for this purpose.

**YOU HEAR A MOTOR CUTTING OFF AND ON ALL NIGHT:** It is probably the water pump, installed in many motorhomes to pressurize the water system. Turn off the switch, and make sure all faucets are turned off.

**YOU HAVE A FLAT TIRE:** Call in a pro with a strong back and good equipment. He can jack up the vehicle and handle the heavy wheels easily.

YOU TURN ON THE FAUCET AND WATER SPUTTERS OUT: It is probably caused by air in the water tank or lines. Turn on the water pump and open a faucet and let it run to clear the air from the lines. MAKE SURE YOU DO NOT RUN THE WATER TANK EMPTY WITH THE PUMP ON, THIS COULD CAUSE AIR IN THE LINES AND BURN OUT THE WATER PUMP.

We have a variety of motorhomes and each and every one is different in some respect. If the above hints do not apply to your particular rental, then check the manual for further details and information.

Please remember these are machines and are subject to Murphy's Law which is "If anything can go wrong, it will." So treat it with respect, try to learn a little about it in the short time you have it and I'm sure you will enjoy it and have a minimum amount of problems.
